Biography

Tom West – Mr. West is the Right of Way Manager and Project Manager for Colonial Pipeline Company. He has been in his current position since September 2005 and has been employed with Colonial Pipeline since April 2002. Tom is responsible for Southern Virginia, North and South Carolina. His duties include managing Colonial's right of way damage prevention program, ensuring consistent application of right of way processes and procedures, negotiating reimbursable complex encroachment agreements with outside agencies and developers, negotiating and documenting right of way acquisitions, damage settlements and third party damages to company facilities. He also manages the right of way side trimming and re-clearing projects for Colonial. Before coming to Colonial Pipeline his experience included 18 years of risk management.

Tom has shown his dedication to damage prevention by participating in the North and South Carolina and Southern Virginia State and local UCC's the City of Danville, Pittsylvania, Halifax, Alamance, Cumberland, Johnston and Davidson County LEPC's and the North and South Carolina Common Ground Alliance Regional Partnerships. He has served as the Chair for the NC Utilities Coordinating Committee. He is a member of the CGA and has served on the CGA's Regional Partners committee. He was instrumental in having the 811 logos painted on Colonial's Tanks near I-40 and the PIPES Plus Program presented by NC811. Tom also worked closely with the other utility stakeholder groups to develop the South Carolina Underground Damage Prevention Law. Currently, Tom is serving on the Board of Directors for both North Carolina 811 and South Carolina 811. Tom has been appointed by the Governor of North Carolina to the NC Underground Damage Prevention Review Board and is currently serving his second term.
